4. To introduce the Russian readership with the basic institutions of foreign law, legal foundations and legal practice in foreign countries and also the main achievements of international researchers in law.
5. To introduce the foreign readership with the basic institutions of Russian law, legal foundations and legal practice in Russia and also the main achievements of Russian researchers in law.
6. To inform of the life of both scientific and professional legal communities.

BASIC PRINCIPLES

1. The editorial board's personal responsibility for achieving the journal's goals and objectives.
2. High demands on the authorship, relevance, originality, theoretical and / or practical significance, quality and reliability of publications.
3. The editorial board's and reviewers' conscientiousness and responsibility for compliance with the ethics rules of publishing, reviewing and editing publications.
